Becoming an Inclusive Church

At St Laurence, we have been reflecting deeply on what it means to be an Inclusive Church. This journey has led us to explore how we can become a place where everyone, regardless of their background or challenges, feels fully welcomed, valued, and loved. Over recent months, we have considered groups who are often overlooked—sometimes intentionally—by society and even within church communities. Among these groups are people with disabilities, those facing mental health challenges, and those who are neurodiverse.

But inclusion is about more than identifying these groups. It requires us to open our eyes, our minds, and our hearts. To truly welcome all people into the life of the church, we need to be prepared to make changes—some of which may make us feel vulnerable, as they ask us to rethink how we do things. This new awareness calls us to examine our own practices and habits, to see where we might unintentionally create barriers that prevent others from fully participating.

One of the challenges we face as a Grade II* listed building is the limitations on what we can physically alter. Yet, while structural changes may be difficult, there are many practical steps we can take to make our space more accessible. Providing large print orders of service is a simple example, but there are other ways awareness can lead to meaningful change. How we welcome someone with anxiety, how we support a person with sensory needs, or how we engage with someone who communicates differently—all of these are opportunities to embody the love and hospitality that God calls us to offer.

This is about more than just ticking boxes. It's about seeing one another as beautifully created and unique, each of us a reflection of the divine. It is about living out the commandment to love our neighbour as God loves us. In this, we come closer to loving God as we are called to do, creating a space where all can belong.

God is present in this journey. When we look at the stories of Scripture, we see a consistent message of inclusion. Jesus reached out to those on the margins, and time and again, we hear the call to welcome the stranger, care for the sick, and love the outcast. Inclusion isn't an optional extra—it's at the very heart of our faith. In making room for everyone, we make room for God to work in and through us.

Though we are only at the beginning of this journey, it has already been a profoundly moving experience. We have been challenged, we have learned, and we have seen how the act of becoming more inclusive asks us to reflect on our own vulnerabilities. But we know this is a journey worth taking, not just because it transforms us, but because it reflects God's boundless love for each person.

Becoming an Inclusive Church

This month, we are also holding a Safeguarding Sunday on 17th November. Safeguarding is essential for an inclusive community because it ensures that our church is a safe space for everyone. For those who may already feel marginalised, knowing that their safety and well-being are prioritised helps them feel secure and welcomed. By focusing on safeguarding, we are taking an important step in building a community where everyone, regardless of their vulnerabilities, can belong without fear. Safeguarding is an act of love, reflecting God's care for all people.

As we move into Advent and Christmas, this focus on inclusion continues to be crucial. It's a time of year when many people—some of whom may not regularly attend—come into our church, whether for services, events, or simply to find space in the busyness of the season. Ensuring that our welcome is open and inclusive during this time is part of living out the Christmas message of God's love coming into the world for all people. Everyone who walks through our doors should experience that love, whether they are visiting for the first time or have been a part of our community for many years.

In the New Year, we will continue our journey by focusing on more groups who may feel marginalised or on the boundaries of society and the church. These themes will be explored in greater depth, allowing us to learn together and discover new ways to embody inclusion in all aspects of our community life.

God is present in this journey. When we look at the stories of Scripture, we see a consistent message of inclusion. Jesus reached out to those on the margins, and time and again, we hear the call to welcome the stranger, care for the sick, and love the outcast. Inclusion isn't an optional extra—it's at the very heart of our faith. In making room for everyone, we make room for God to work in and through us.

As we continue this exploration, we invite you to look out for discussion groups in the New Year. These groups will be a space to unpack some of these themes in smaller gatherings, offering a chance to reflect, learn, and share as we journey together toward a more inclusive future.

Let us continue to ask how we can love one another more fully, and in doing so, how we can love God more fully. This is just the beginning of what promises to be a much longer, transformative journey for our church and community.







Revd Martin Writes ...

We are in a season of the year when we remember in a variety of ways. We remember the Fair/Mop, setting the clocks back, Halloween and Guy Fawkes night. The church has seasonal things to remember too. The "Lights of Love" reflective space for baby loss awareness, the Commemoration of the departed service in November, the public and church service of Remembrance for uniformed personnel.

Remembering - we do it.

It can connect to a public event ("what were you doing when Lockdown was announced?" "Do you remember Kate and William marrying?"). Other remembering links to personal events. This can be intensely emotional - a birth or marriage, a success in education or getting a job, meeting our life partner. If we are fortunate, we have more good things to remember than bad. Remembering can reconnect us to emotions and thoughts of what we think is important in life.

I vividly remember when my late mother-in-law was invited to a special lunch. This was for people who were in a comparable situation to her – a widow. She was pleased to be asked and enjoyed the company.

I remember a meeting and being humbled that the person chairing was there when a family member had just been released from hospital after a prolonged illness. I know I would not have been able to do that.

In work I have heard about "servant leadership." This is the idea that leaders do not lead from the front but are there to serve their workforce and put them first. I remember the actions of a boss who did just that.

For people in public office giving up the things that go with that role can be memorable. I remember someone giving up their badges of office, their uniform and taking the long walk out of the building, the doors closing behind them,

How does this connect with remembering?

Well, I am remembering the ways the Bishop of Worcester John Inge has struck me. Inviting my mother-in-law to a lunch for clergy widows and widowers, chairing a meeting of the Diocese when his daughter had come home from hospital, modelling the servant leadership of Jesus by washing my feet before ordination. Finally with retiring laying his staff on the altar, taking off his robes and walking out of Worcester Cathedral. All memorable events and linked to powerful emotions. We remember to pray for him and his family in his retirement.

Events and emotions can be wonderful to remember. They can also be traumatic and upsetting. If there are things where your remembering needs help, we can help you celebrate the good. We can also help you hold and work through the bad. If there are things where your remembering needs help, we remember God loves you even if that is not a memory you share.





Chris covered many aspects detailing the amazing and diverse work carried out by this service and also covered safety in the home and how we can implement simple checks to help prevent a fire and in the event of one, procedures to go through.

He also advised us that anyone can get in touch with the service and arrange a free safety check. Someone will come to your home and assess any problem areas and if necessary fit smoke alarms and/or carbon monoxide detectors free of charge. They also provide a winter warm pack with thermal blanket, hat socks gloves and snood again free of charge for anyone they may come across who is struggling to keep warm, living with little or no heat. We all learned some extremely valuable lessons and went away with some of the informative leaflets Chris brought along. During September some of our ladies visited Winterbourne gardens in Edgbaston, travelling by train to the university followed by a brisk walk to Winterbourne to take in the gardens, house and break for lunch. Our next meeting is on Wednesday 6th November and is a craft evening. With the countdown to Christmas one of is our ladies Karen, is guiding us through making a Christmas star to hang on the tree. 




